

YOUR CHURCH TRUSTEES AT WORK

WE, THR TRUSTEES OF THE UMC OF WAYNE, wanted to keep you updated on the ongoing projects that we are dealing with to keep our aging building up to code and useful as we head into the Fall of 2023.

The commode in our main women's room has now been repaired and air freshers have been installed in all our restrooms. Our new cleaning company, City Wide Solutions, has begun our annual stripping, washing, and waxing of our floors by doing our main bathrooms and the three primary classrooms used by our tenants, Giggle and Grow Preschool.

The waxing of the floors will be competed in late September or early October as we will do the Fellowship Hall, main Hallway, and the Narthex Entrance way after the Annual Rummage Sale.

A major leak and roof problem in the Sacristy is now being addressed with bids accepted for the work so we may proceed to correct this ongoing problem.

The Parsonage chimney project is also in the bid process as we try to secure a contractor to perform the repair and deal with the leaks coming from the chimney that go from the roof down into the Parsonage basement. We continue to be aware of the expensive nature of this project, but it has now become the number one priority to be corrected before further damage is incurred.

We have also had to deal with a leak in the air conditioning condenser that flooded the Pastor's inner and outer offices as well as replacement of the breaker control switch that controlled the air conditioning.

We continue to be mindful of the costs associated with the maintenance of our beautiful buildings, but time has caught up with us and there are urgent fixes that need to be addressed along with our monthly maintenance costs.

We are thankful for the support of the Congregation and its donations in helping us to maintain our house of worship in a useable and functional manner.

Food insecurity is when a person is unable to obtain a sufficient amount of healthy food on a day-to-day basis.


