

A note from our Pastor...

Resurrection Hope

When asked what reading material would be most helpful if stranded on an island, the New Testament scholar N.T. Wright states, without hesitation, The Gospel of John chapter 20. I agree. This text embodies Resurrection Hope; that we are never alone and God is always creating something new and beautiful. Mary stood in the garden-weeping outside of the tomb. The past three days had been too much. Her world had fallen apart. Shock, Grief and despair embraced her heart. How – why – was the tomb empty? And through her tears, the kind of tears that just keep falling, she looked into the tomb and saw two angels. She sees them and hears them speak. She is not startled. For her tears are connecting her to a deeper reality.

"Why are you weeping?", they ask. "They have taken away my Lord and I do not know where he is.", she answers. She turns and sees the gardener and the Gardener asks the same question -"Why are you weeping? And asks another question,"Whom are you looking for?" She answers, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." Then Jesus speaks her name.

I imagine a long pause here as it dawns on her that her Lord and Savior has not been taken away. Through her tears she begins to see clearly; Jesus is indeed the Gardener, the Word/Logos the creating One who was with God in the beginning (See John 1:1-5) For Mary the darkness is fading, the sun is rising above the trees, an Hallelujah is rising from her heart.

Last October when my sister passed into eternal life, I felt as if I had been stranded on an Island; shocked, alone, heartbroken with endless tears. Looking back on those first few months, I realized that I was called by name, held and steadied by our Triune God. Angels accompanied me. Not celestial angels - human angels. When I received the news about Karla's passing, I was with 2 angels; my husband and a dear friend. Whenever grief would attempt to paralyze me and card, a gift, or a text sent by angels would arrive expressing loving kindness. Angels continue to call or show up just when I need them, to invite me to tell the story of why I am weeping.

Like Mary, I have come to realize that something good is happening among all this... something wonderful, something that gives me hope. An new day has dawned. And not just in my personal life but also here in this garden community that we call the UMC in Wayne. Here in this place we are the angels that listen to each other's stories through tears and laughter, and bring healing and loving kindness to our world. Here in this place I am seeing new life - new possibilities - NEW CREATION! Friends, our Easter Hope is that our Great Gardener Creating God is for us and with us, knows us by name, and never leaves us alone!

He is Risen Indeed! Alleluia! Pastor Ninabeth

Message from the Finance Committee

We are blessed here at UMC in Wayne as we work hard toward financial stability. Our giving is consistent with 2024 averages. We continue to work on fund raisers like grocery cards and soup sales to support our ministries. Our rents currently represent 44% of our overall income. In first guarter of 2025 we met all of our salaries and operating expenses but are behind in our conference obligations (both billables and shared ministries). Our average weekly giving of \$2,263 is lower than our budget need of \$2,735 (resulting in a deficit of \$472 weekly). The great challenge that we have in managing the finances of our church day to day is cash flow. I'm sure many of you can relate. In April Columbia bank closed our line of credit and asked us to convert our Letter of Credit into a 7year term loan. The current balance of \$59,057 at a rate of 6.5% will result in monthly loan payments of \$877, This is an increase of \$460 per month. The finance team is meeting this month to discuss options to help improve the financial sustainability of our church. We will bring our thoughts to council.



On a final note, we'd like to thank Christine Mercado for her tireless efforts managing the day to day as our treasurer. We are thankful for the continued dedication of Dawn and Patty. We are very lucky to have dedicated servants on our Finance team; however, our team is small so if you are interested in joining us please contact Pastor Ninabeth or any of the finance team members. Please pray for our upcoming meeting as we discern opportunities to fund our ministries.







The 2025 Lenten soup sale was a great success!
